SCW voters elect new Governing Board Directors

The Recreation Centers of Sun City West swore in two new Directors-elect and welcomed back two incumbents following the conclusion of its Governing Board Election.

Dick Rhoades and Jack Leary will join the Board come July 1. They will be joined by incumbents Tim Hurley and Harry Stannebein, as well as continuing Directors Donna Maloney, Anne Brown, Lisa Vines, Roberta Davidson and Sharon Hettick. Rhoades came out on the top of balloting with 3,768 votes. He was followed by Hurley with 3,696 votes, Leary with 3,398 and Stannebein with 3,082. Stannebein will be seated to an unfinished two-year term. The other three will serve three-year terms. Candidate George Kuchtyak Jr. was unsuccessful in gaining a seat, with 2,495 votes.

All terms start July 1, although the candidates were sworn in immediately after the

polls closed. In April, the new Directors will join continuing Directors in choosing officers for the 2022-23 fiscal year.

The volunteer Governing Board is comprised of nine Owner Members who are elected to serve three-year terms. Vacancies with shorter terms are filled as the need arises.

A total of 4,448 votes were cast in the election. That's a 17.1 percent turnout.





Internet company beginning fiber installation in Sun City West

As a service to the community, the Recreation Centers of Sun City West wishes to advise residents that the company Zona Wyyered is planning construction in the near future throughout the community.

Zona Wyyerd provides home internet service similar to Cox and CenturyLink. The Rec Centers has no association with Zona Wyyerd and does not endorse the company over any other internet provider, but is providing residents with a heads up since the construction activity will be highly visible throughout our neighborhoods.

Work is scheduled to begin sometime in the next 30-60 days and will continue through the end of the year. Residents will see Zona Wyyerd work trucks and contractors around several different locations in the community, including rights of way areas. The work includes locating and marking underground utilities, so residents can expect sidewalk

markings and small flags in their yards during the periods when Zona is working on their streets. The company has county permits authorizing this work.

As construction moves through Sun City West, Zona will provide notices to nearby residents in the form of letters and door hangers. Those notices will include a phone number residents can call if they have concerns or questions. Residents can also go to Zona's website (https://www.fiber.events/) for informa-

tion or to sign up for emailed construction updates.

Questions about the construction should be directed to Zona, not the Recreation Centers of Sun City West. This press release and other future announcements from the Rec Centers about Zona Wyyerd are meant to inform the community about their work and any disruptions that may occur from it

RCSCW slates upcoming spring projects, closures

Beardsley Recreation Center-Swim & Fitness Building; full building closure to begin May 2, until tentative completion planned for July 1.

The following scheduled projects are:

- 1. Swim & Fitness Lobby Enclosure Renovate existing open-air lobby to create sealed air-conditioned space with finished windows and entry door at the arches, including decorative ceiling, finished walls, new monitor station, seating areas, and digital TV display.
- 2. End of Pool Carpet Area Remove existing floor and wall fountain features, repair concrete, and finish area flooring with new rubber flooring for multi-purpose use and exercise area.
- 3. Pool and Spa Wall Décor-Repaint all pool and spa interior walls with new paint theme, in-

With the calendar turning to cluding refurbishing the Teroring and the winter visitors razzo perimeter wainscot.

RH Johnson Recreation Center - Men's Club; full building closure (except radio broadcast room) to begin May 2 until tentative completion planned for June 10.

The following scheduled projects are:

- 1. Refurbish all interior walls with new paint theme.
- 2. Install new decorative millwork, includes perimeter wall storage cabinetry, base cabinetry, solid surface multi-purpose countertop space, and newly renovated monitor station.
- 3. Install new luxury vinyl plank in portion of Men's Club room entry, kitchenette area, hallways, and Stagecoach meeting room, including decorative modular carpet in main Men's club room.

Palm Ridge Recreation Center - Pickleball courts 11-18 resurface and paint; only courts 11-18 will be closed beginning May 30 for approximately two weeks (weather permitting) to make any repairs, resurface texture, and repaint lines.



GENERAL RULES

- Host members are responsible for the conduct of guests and for any damages to facilities or equipment by their guests.
- Children under age 16 must be accompanied by a responsible adult at all times. There are no exceptions.
- Children must be signed in by a member with a valid recreation card using guest credits.
- Children must follow all rules of the Association and must not interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of the facilities by residents and other adult guests.

BILLIARDS: Children who are taller than 52 inches and can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the monitor that they can properly use the cue stick without causing damage to the table may use the Billiards Room.

BOWLING: Children may bowl at the R.H. Johnson Sports Pavilion if they can safely handle a bowling ball.

FITNESS CENTERS & HOT TUBS: Children under the age of 16 are not permitted in these facilities.

GOLF: Children may play golf when they can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the starter that they understand the rules of golf and are capable of playing without disturbing the play of members. Children may not play during weekly club play. Children must be 18 years of age with a valid driver's license to operate a golf cart on RCSCW golf courses.

LIBRARY: Children under the age of 16 may use the Library when accompanied by a parent or guardian; children under 19 unaccompanied by a host member are not permitted to use the Data Resource Center computers. Only the holder of a valid recreation card may check out library materials. Children over the age of 9 accompanied by an adult may participate in Virtual Reality programs.

MINI-GOLF: Children old enough to walk and carry a golf club safely and who do not interfere with the peaceful enjoyment of members may play miniature golf.

POOLS: Children under age 16 may swim during the designated Family Swim Hours; check suncitywest.com for a list of hours. Children who are not toilet trained must wear a swim diaper while in the pool. Adult supervision must be provided at all times for the duration of the swim. Children are not permitted in the spas. They may not be in the pool area at times other than the designated children's swim hours.

OTHER FACILITIES: Children under age 16 may use other Association facilities when accompanied by a recreation card holder or other responsible adult at all times. (See Guest Policy).




