Isn't it a fairness issue?

At a special meeting of the Recreation Centers' Governing Board held June 5, 2019, the Board unanimously voted to restate/enforce an existing policy (Fa8) that defines how we handle a member's guests; calling for complete and concise enforcement of how a member's guest gains access to our facilities (pools, golf, mini golf, etc.). The full policy can be found on our website (https://info.suncitywest.com/n ew-guest-rec-card-policy-tobe-implemented-july-1/).

As outlined in this policy; ALL guests will need to be accompanied by a cardholder (in good standing); which is defined as an owner, tenant or associate member. If you are asking "why we are 'again' actively enforcing this policy" — it is because some folks in our community are taking advantage of the liberal transferability of member cards; giving their cards to short term tenants and other unauthorized guests.

Investigation of short-term rentals advertising in the 85375 zip code indicates there are 300 plus short-term rentals currently being advertised; several using phrases such as "full recreational facilities available for \$3.50 per day." A person who rents one of these is given the member's rec card (or keychain fob) to take to the pool, mini golf or table tennis, pay \$3.50 and have the same amenities we all enjoy and pay

for in our a n n u a 1 dues.

The policy reinforces the facility monitors' duty to match the photo on the rec card

with the photo in our computer system, with the person standing in front of them. With the updated policy approved by the Board, all three must match. No one can use someone else's card to gain entry; this includes guests authorized by the member. Instead, the member must be on site to sign in their guest.

Should the rec card not have a photo, or the photo be so outdated (more than five years) or for some other reason not look like the member, the member's information will be recorded and he or she will be warned to get a replacement card (including an updated photo) from Member Services within one week.

If the member turns in their old card, they will not be charged for the replacement.

Sun City West is not a resort to be used by short-term renters. Del Webb never intended it to be a vacation destination for visitors. Yes - we have lakes, golf courses, pools, tennis, pickleball and a bowling center that may be attractive to vacationers, but we are also an age-restricted member community. We pay dues to have our facilities look and function great.

There are rules for those who lease their homes, including one that requires a property owner (member) to get a written lease with the renter. This then allows the tenant to purchase a tenant card and gain access to our facilities during the terms of their lease period. During that lease period, the owner's card is suspended for the rented property. This ensures we do not see double the wear and tear on our facilities.

The rise in short-term rentals throughout the country has other communities like ours scrambling to figure out how to regulate facility usage and fees. Your Governing Board and Operations staff are working to ensure that those who rent out their homes are doing so within our regulations, that they are age compliant, and that they are legally registered with the State of Arizona.

We are one of many communities across the state where a battle is brewing to determine the future of short-term rentals (less than 30 days), with high stakes for both the landlords and the communities in which they exist.

If you watch the news you will know that many communities are exploring how to deal with this issue. I think that this craze of short-term rentals is unhealthy for our community and here's why: Short term rentals devalue our community; our sense of community is eroded; and we don't know the people next door if they change each day or week. Neighbors are our most important asset in Sun City West. That, my friends, is the fairness issue!

Asset Preservation v. Member Dues How do these funding sources differ?

We get a lot of questions here at the Rec Centers every year after the new fiscal year kicks off on July 1 and the newly available funding allows us to do many of our big capital projects.

Here at the Rec Centers, "capital" means a project or equipment purchase that costs more than \$5,000 and has a lifespan of 5 years or longer. Both of those criteria must be met to qualify as capital.

Capital projects are funded through our Reserves, which come from two sources: Asset Preservation Fees (which is the bulk of this funding), and excess revenues at the end of the fiscal year.

Our Asset Preservation Fees come from new Sun City West homeowners when they buy a home here. It is a one-time fee they pay as they are moving into a community with pre-existing amenities that were paid for by residents who came here before them. It is their buy-in fee, if you will.

Member dues do not fund capital projects. Member dues pay operational costs that are incurred every year. This includes salaries, utilities, and equipment purchases that don't qualify as capital.

(At the end of a fiscal year, if

we have cost-savings in our operations budget, that money is transfered per the Bylaws into our Reserve Funds, which then funds capital. That is the only time member dues go toward capital expenses.)

Our current Space Utilization projects are a good example of these different funding types. Major renovations that will be occurring at Kuentz Rec Center in the near future are obviously capital - they will cost more than \$5,000, and have a lifespan of more than 5 years.

On the other hand, some of the Space Utilization work that we are doing at Beardsley falls under Operations since it is being performed by the Facilities Maintenance staff.

New Guest Policy

- ➤ All guests wishing to use RCSCW facilities must now be accompanied by the owner of the recreation card being used to sign in
- Recreation Cardholders must be in good standing to enter a facility or bring a guest
- Cardholders are required to be with their guest during the initial sign-in
- With the exception of the library, cardholders are not required to stay with their guest for the duration of their visit unless the guest is under 16
- Upon initial check-in and payment for the guests, the owner will be given a receipt that the guest may use for reentry to that facility or any other RCSCW facility
- Reentry receipt is only valid for the day that it was provided to the guest
- Guests at the library must always be accompanied by a member, with the exception of paid services such as Virtual Reality and the Data Resource Center
- Cardholders needing a medical or caregiver waiver may call Membership at 623-544-6100 for information about requirements to obtain such a waiver

Photo ID Requirements

- All recreation cardholders are required to have an up-to-date photo on their card and in the computer system
- Any owner presenting a card with an outdated or missing photo will be given one week to update their photo before the card is deactivated
- During the deactivation period, members will not be able to enter facilities or play golf at resident rates
- Any annual golf cards purchased by the member will be deactivated at the same time
- No refunds or pro-rating of these cards while they are deactivated
- To obtain a new photo and card, come visit Member Services
- An updated photo and card is provided free of charge as long as the old card is turned into Membership





Retiring in the summer of 2017, Sue DeBrocke wasted no time jumping into the world of fused glass when she joined the Copper Enamel and Glass Arts Club that same summer. Coming up on two years of retirement, Sue continues to enjoy making fused glass pieces, many of which she

Editor's note: Welcome to animal she plans to design. With the use of a few reference photos and her natural drawing ability, Sue completes her drawing and moves onto the next step, the Gap method. The Gap method is an online tutorial created by Cristina Grumezescu that teaches a special method of fused glass making. Originally intended to make dishes, Sue learned the Gap method and modified it so she could make animals with the process. Next she places her animals into a kiln for eight hours until they are complete.

Once completed, many of Sue's fused glass animals make their way over to the Village Store where they are placed on the shelves and walls of the store for residents and guests to purchase.

Outside of the fused glass animals she makes with the Copper Enameling and Glass Arts Club, Sue has also found herself creating and crafting with some of the other arts and crafts clubs, such as Toy-Ki Silver and the Lapidary clubs. Sue had also spent some time with the Stained Glass Club.





Golf FAQ

Q: If you have a bad lie in a bunker, (i.e. a fried egg on the side wall), can you take relief outside of the bunker?

A: Under Rule 19.3b, Extra Relief Option, Yes! As an extra relief option when a player's ball is in a bunker, for a total of two penalty strokes, the player may take back-on-the-line relief outside the bunker under Rule 19.2b. So if a player decides that his or her ball in a bunker is unplayable, the player has four options: 1) For one penalty stroke, the player may take stroke-anddistance relief; 2) For one penalty stroke, the player may take back-on-the-line relief in the bunker; 3) For one penalty stroke, the player may take lateral relief in the bunker; 4) For a total of two penalty strokes, the player may take back-on-the-line relief outside the bunker based on a reference line going straight back from the hole through the spot of the original ball.
