

## New guest, rec card policy impacts Sun City West members

Sun City West residents, golfers and guests need to be aware of a new policy approved by the Governing Board for implementation July 1.

The Recreation Centers of Sun City West will be implementing a new guest policy and ID photo requirements at all check-in stations. This includes the four recreation centers, the seven golf courses, Sports Pavilion and R.H. Johnson Library.

Approved by the Governing Board on June 5, the new policy will require all guests to be accompanied by the owner of the recreation card being used to sign in. Additionally, any owner presenting a card with an outdated photo, or missing a photo in the computer system, will be given one week to obtain an updated photo before the card is deactivated. Any annual golf cards purchased by the member will be deactivated at the same time; there will be no re-

funds or pro-rating of these cards while they are deactivated. It is the golfers' responsibility to obtain an updated rec card within one week to prevent loss of these privileges.

The Board decided to update its policy to protect members' investment in the community. The Association has seen an uptick in the number of outsiders becoming




## Sizzling Summer Series features a variety of music


Beat the heat with great musical entertainment as the Rec Centers brings back the Sizzling Summer Series.

Also, take extra care when going out with your pet for a walk. Sidewalks and asphalt can become extremely hot during the summer months. Wait until night time, when the sidewalks have cooled down, or go in the early morning before the sun rises.

## Rec card holders must be present to sign-in guests

aware of Sun City West’s many amenities and attempting to use them without being legitimate members or guests. Members pay an annual fee to belong to the Rec Centers, and the amenities are reserved for use by them and their guests. Golf and bowling allow outside participation at a public rate, but the recreation centers and library are not open to the public.

Only Owners, Associates and Tenants may bring guests. In the past, guests could bring the member’s card to sign in. This will not be allowed starting July 1. Cardholders needing a medical or caregiver waiver may call Membership at 623-544-6100 for information about requirements to obtain such a waiver.

Recreation Cardholders must be in good standing to enter a facility or bring a guest. Cardholders are only required to be with the guest during the initial sign-in process each day. With the exception of the library, they are

not required to stay for the duration of the guest’s visit unless the guest is under 16. Upon initial check-in and payment for the guests, the owner will be given a receipt, which the guests can then use for reentry to that facility or any other RCSCW facility, for that day only. Guests at the library must always be accompanied by a member, with the exception of paid services such as Virtual Reality and the Data Resource Center.

Cardholders who present an outdated photo will be notified by staff that they must obtain a new photo and a new rec card from Member Services. The outdated card will be logged, and the member will be given one week to visit Member Services to obtain their new card. There will be no charge for the updated photo and card, provided the member turns in his/her old card.

Outdated cards will be deactivated after one week, and members will not be able to use those cards to enter facilities or play golf at resident rates.

### As you get older, so does your rec card.



 If you present a rec card with an outdated photo, you will be given a one week notice to update your photo and obtain a new rec card. Failure to update your card will result in the card and any associated annual golf cards being deactivated until you update your card. Visit Member Services to obtain a new rec card, which will be free of charge if you turn in your old card.

## Summer tasks for HOA boards

The summer months are the perfect time to take stock of your Homeowners Association board. An ongoing task is to compare your current expenses with your budget. Are your HOA expenses on track with your planned budget? Which items were more



(or less!) expensive than you expected? What additional expenses do you expect to incur

next year? Are your reserve funds on track to cover any large expenses looming in the future? Are your financial accounts in income producing financial instruments?

If your HOA is planning to start a large project such as roof repair or replacement, painting, common area landscaping, asphalt repair, etc., when will your project be fully funded? Begin planning the steps needed to complete your project. Have you established a time-frame for the project? How many bids do you

plan to obtain? Have you identified which vendors you will contact for bids? Have you asked other OHOA HOA board members which vendors they hired and why?

The summer "break" is also a good time to determine if your board members (especially your new board members) have all of the pertinent legal documents for your HOA: Sun City West CC&Rs, Sun City West Annexation/Expansion Area CC&Rs (if applicable), and the CC&Rs, by-laws, and Articles of Incorporation for your specific HOA. Does each member of your board know specifically what their job entails? Also, consider writing three to five goals for your HOA to accomplish in the coming year.



After our floor replacement last summer, we returned all the merchandise to the store and started selling. I did not have time to go through the boxes we packed and had stored, so this summer, it's sort, toss and shred time.

The sales for the Village Store and Arts and Crafts Fairs continue to go up. Every time I think we have reached the top; we continue to increase. I attribute the increase in sales to our marvelous artists who are creating new and exciting items

every day.

Our point-of-sale system has all kinds of information that I have been digesting. I have some interesting statistics from our season, Sept. 1, 2018, to May 31, 2019.

Each club has categories of items that they make and sell. Due to the various colloquialisms of the country, the same item often has a different name. When we created the categories, this was taken into consideration. For example, hot pads and potholders are the same thing. For my purpose, I have combined some

categories to obtain the following.

Our top 10 sellers for the season are:

1. Earrings: 835 pair (made by eight clubs)
2. Pendants: 733 (made by six clubs)
3. Scrubbies: 702 (includes 504 standard round and 198 scrubby cloths from two clubs)
4. Holiday items: 620 (these include household decorations, cards and jewelry by all clubs)
5. Birthday Cards: 531 (includes general, woman, child, man from mainly three clubs)
6. Bowl Warmers: 365 (microwave use; made in three clubs)
7. Potholders: 278 (includes hot pads, from our clubs)
8. Bracelet: 250 (made by six clubs)
9. Magnets: 206 (made by one club)
10. Trivets: 181 (made by three clubs)

The versatility of our POS program allows me to do what I love - statistics. I wish I would have realized this love when I was back in school. Oh well, at least I get to play with it now. I hope you find this as interesting as I do. For those of you that don't, sorry!



## Guidelines for RCSCW golf courses

- Must check in 15 minutes prior to assigned tee time
- Wear proper golf attire. See dress code flyer below for more information
- Each player must have a set of golf clubs
- Present proper identification to the starter when checking in to play golf
- All beer/wine must be purchased at clubhouse
- Golfers are responsible for all damage to private property
- A golfer must have permission from the homeowner to retrieve a golf ball from private property
- Use proper golf etiquette
- Observe local rules
- Repair divots and ball marks
- Please use 90-degree cart path rule as often as possible
- No more than one cart with a single person per group
- Please do not leave unoccupied carts on the golf course
- All carts not being used must be parked in the course parking lot
- Please obey all cart signs
- Play ready golf whenever possible
- Keep up with the golfers in front of you

## Golfers should be mindful of dress code

**Men** – Shirts with sleeves to at least mid-bicep is required. Non-conforming clothing includes but not limited to: tank tops, sleeveless shirts and swimwear.

Slacks/Shorts – Shorts must be mid-thigh in length or longer.

**Women** – Shirts may be with or without collars and sleeves. Shirts must be non-revealing in nature. No spaghetti straps, fishnet, tube tops, halters,

midriff exposing tops, swimwear or the like.

Slacks, Shorts and Skirts – Shorts/Skirts must be mid-thigh in length or longer.

**Footwear** – Proper footwear is required to be worn on the golf course and practice facility. Spikeless/soft spike golf shoes, golf sandals, flip flops, flat soled shoes are examples of proper footwear. Any footwear that would damage the greens is strictly prohibited. Shoes

MUST be worn in the pro-shop due to the AZ Department of Health regulations.

All clothing must be hemmed and free of holes and tears. Any clothing displaying profanity, inappropriate wording or controversial messages will not be considered appropriate. If in doubt, the final determination of appropriate clothing will be determined by the golf shop staff on duty. Players must comply with their judgment.




