

Coronavirus: SCW extends closures; begins prepping re-opening plans

In response to the anticipated rise in coronavirus cases in Sun City West, the Recreation Centers of Sun City West closed its seven golf courses Tuesday, April 14. Courses and facilities will reopen as soon as possible once the Association feels it is safe to do so. The Rec Centers are currently planning operational safety procedures necessary for re-opening.

The Rec Centers closed courses an extension of its earlier progression of closures while the state and nation dealt with the spread of coronavirus.

"The governor (did) not mandate the closure of golf courses, but we believed the time had come to take this action to protect against the spread of coronavirus," said General Manager Bill Schwind. "We had taken several measures prior to this to ensure our golfers were socially distancing themselves, not touching flag poles or the cups, not renting our golf carts. But we wanted to continue being at the forefront of this."

Maintenance at the golf courses continued, and aerification projects were moved forward to take advantage of the

closure. This means the golf courses were CLOSED to the community as of April 14. Player Assistants were reassigned to patrol the courses.

"We understand our residents are out there using some of the outdoor spaces for walking," Schwind said. "We aren't going to police those areas at this time, but we ask our members to please practice social distancing and wear masks. Covid-19 is not something to take your chances with, especially given our community's demographics. The community sidewalks, which are more extensive, may provide a better opportunity to get outside without getting close to others. We encourage residents to exercise there, not on the limited spaces on our walking tracks and sports fields."

The Rec Centers Pandemic

Task Force and key staff are meeting regularly and will reevaluate the closures as the situation across the state unfolds.

Member dues are still being accepted via mail, the online portal or a drop box in front of the Member Services Office. Those who are late on dues that are payable after April 1, until we reopen, will have late fees waived, but full dues are still required per the agreement each

homeowner signs when buying a home in Sun City West. Dues go toward maintaining and operating the facilities, and are not a guarantee of facility availability. The Rec Centers will reopen the facilities as soon as it is feasible without jeopardizing resident and employee safety.

The Rec Centers is working closely with Arizona Fire and Medical Authority, as well as taking guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Arizona Department of Health Services to provide updates. The best action at this time would be for those who need tax services to seek a paid preparer or use tax software designed for this purpose.


Kyle Bandy joins the band on steel, to add all the perfect leads and harmonies with the guitars. Together these mem-



Having a plan in place for your pet

For the pet lovers out there, we want to pass along a few things you can do for your furry friend during these uncertain times.

Who can take care of your pet? If you were to get sick during these times, it is best to have a plan in place for who can take care of your pet while you recover. People to consider would be those in your home, neighbors, friends, family and co-workers. For those of you who live alone or may not be able to find someone to care for your pet, we would recommend reaching out to Chance Shelter (chanceshelter.org). They have experience working with seniors in Sun City and Sun City West.

Prepare a pet supply kit. Having supplies for your pet right now may come in handy if down the road you find yourself in a situation where proper supplies are unavailable. Some things you may want to include in your pet supply kit can be:

- Name and contact info of who can care for your pet
- Food, treats, leash, toys and other supplies
- A crate or carrier to transport your pet
- Collar with ID tags
- Medications and prescriptions, along with instructions on how to give them to your pet
- Veterinarian's information

Rip 'n Sew Co-President

It was nearly a month ago that I posted a picture of me wearing a fabric face mask. I thought it was a joke until my Facebook community of health-care providers set me straight. That sent me into a deep dive of information for two days.

I found Kathleen Emert who was connecting Phoenix nurses with people who could sew masks. I redesigned a pattern that would work for nurses - larger to fit over an N95 mask, with slots on the bottom to insert filters, fabric ties, solid on one side, etc. I sent a message to the Rip 'n Sew Club members; and then I recorded a plea for help in creating masks. Then my world exploded! The Sun City West community showed up in a big way! Some asked: "I don't sew, how can I help?"

During an 11-day period we drew in 182

volunteers (127 sewers), including members Inspire Church and Palo Verde Patchers, we made more than 3,000 masks for health care workers and first responders throughout the Valley.

Volunteers were excited to help and were coming in at a rapid speed. I did not want more than three people in our house at a time, so we set up the courtyard with bins to hand out kits, take in masks and meet providers, armed with donated hand sanitizer and

wipes for everyone. Everyday the program morphed, people donated fabric, supplies, food and money to buy more supplies.

We have not sought out a single person, they hear what we are doing and find us. We are now committed to supply 100 masks a day to our fire department, one for the first responder and another for the patient. We now average 400 masks a day. Share the video and process with your own community. And I pray that you get people to come forward and volunteer because we are better together!

If you recall, RCSCW made the decision several weeks ago to close its recreation facilities, except for golf courses. Our decision preceded our Governor and all university and national sports associations decisions to do the same.

Our main decision to keep golf open is the fact that golfers do not require a shared physical object to play (a ball being handed back and forth). We took special precautions to ensure social distancing, making sure we adapted and removed most touchable items (flags, holes, rental carts, ball washers, rakes etc.) Yes, there was some early complaining but that grew mostly into thank you messages.

Look at the situation since then. The Arizona numbers within Maricopa County are growing and we are being told that the peak is coming.

If a large wave, hurricane or tornado is approaching, do you not prepare and take cover?

I have learned over years of competition that winning requires a bit of defense to be played.

What appears to be one of the saving graces from this virus is isolation, quarantine and hopefully warm sunny weather. Other countries severely impacted by this virus have adopted this type of stay at home behavior and things are improving and lives are saved.

This is serious and we are managing as such.

With the spread of this virus continuing to grow locally, we feel that the best thing for everyone to do at this time is to stay home.

So far 14 states have

specifically banned golf being played (California, Illinois, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, Pennsylvania, Vermont, Washington and Wisconsin), and the situation is ever-changing. In some cases, courses, clubs or resorts have opted to pause operations even if their states haven't mandated it.

A few days ago, our Governor made changes to his initial definition of essential services (beauty salons, manicures and tattoo parlors). I'm not certain that golf is too far behind.

Dealing with the national trends, local health official data and a recent spike in activity, we made the decision to close for the safety of all.

I golf, too, and I understand the frustration as I would rather be out there with you than doing a lot of other things.

You can fault me all you want for making unpopular decisions, but those decisions are honest, transparent and defensible.

You should not find fault in our Association's attempt to keep members safe and protecting our employees from unnecessary harm.

The best advice given to me is to "Stay At Home," wash your hands and I hope to see you on the tee box soon.







Down time presents opportunity to take on forgotten tasks

While we hope to resume our “normal” lives in early May, it seems doubtful our wonderful Sun City West lifestyle will return. Assuming your HOA Board still has a bit of “extra time” on its hands, there are several HOA-related items can be done to help ease the Board’s commitments that are sure to come once the COVID-19 pandemic has released its grip on the world.



This is a good time to do tasks that often get shoved aside or put off until an emergency arises. Below are a few suggestions:

- Take stock of absolutely everything in your HOA – the physical structures, roof conditions, status of your common elements including paint, asphalt, trees, rock or grass, irrigation system, and landscaping. Are there plants that can be removed to reduce water usage? Do some plants need more severe pruning? Does your irrigation system need new clocks, valves, timers, risers, sprinkler heads, or complete replacement?
- If you are planning a large project in the coming month, use this quiet time to plan. Determine exactly what you need and create a written proposal that includes every item that must be included in each estimate or bid. Determine which vendors you will ask to submit a bid. Obtain three to five bids.
- Review your budget. A mid-year review of every expense item on your budget will help you assess if you are still on track or if adjustments need to be made. Determine now if other items should be added to your 2021 budget that were not included in your 2020 budget.
 - Double check your contracts are up to date.
 - Review, revise, or begin rewriting your HOA documentation including Bylaws, CC&Rs, and Rules. Make sure that all of your documents are readable.
 - Do you have an important issue that needs to be discussed with your homeowners? If so, plan to hold a town meeting to discuss these issues.

Use this “break” time as an opportunity to advance your HOA agenda forward.




FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY BOOK SALE

Arizona. To access them visit azlibrary.gov/dazl/online-reference-resources. To access these resources you don't need a library card. The login requires your Arizona zip code. Some of the resources will then have you create a login for that specific resource.

There is a collection of Chilton automotive repair manuals. There are several resources for literature. NoveList Plus lets you put in an author or title you like and it will give you lists of books and authors that are similar that you might like to try.

If you are interested in learning new language skills you can try out Pronunciator. There are 163 languages to choose from. Learning Express Library has a section on computers skills that you can take online courses in. You can find collections of academic journals from Gale Academic OnFile. 

Web Portal FAQ

Question: If I have used the portal before with a password, do I need a new password?

Answer: If you have not used the portal since June 22, 2016, you will need to click "New User Password Retrieval" at the login screen. The computer will email you a link for a temporary password.

Q: What if I do not receive an e-mail? And I receive the message "Success: Your password has been sent to your e-mail address. Proceed to login."

A: If you do not receive an e-mail within 15 minutes - a) Check your SPAM or Junk folder in your email client. We suggest entering "golfops@suncitywest.com" in your address book so it will be recognized as an authorized contact; b) If there is still no e-mail, contact Member Services to confirm your correct e-mail address is in your member profile. Member Services: 623-544-6100 Monday through Friday 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Q: What if my password looks like my old one? Or you receive a message: "Credentials are invalid" means an incorrect password has been entered.

A: Your temporary password should be at least eight characters long. Please note that the password is case sensitive. Also verify if the password has a "0" or a zero "0". I have put this in the example so you can see the difference. If you receive a new password that is less than eight characters, wait 15 minutes and go back to the login screen and go through the New User Password Retrieval again and the computer will send you a new e-mail with the correct password.

Q: Can I change my password?

A: Yes. Once you have successfully logged in with the computer generated password you may go to: My Account > My Profile > Edit Profile (located under the box with the head outline) > Manage Account > Manage Password. You will enter Current Password > New Password (minimum of eight characters) > Confirm Password > Change Password located in the blue box. If successful, you will receive an e-mail confirming you have changed your password.

Q: I have logged in at least once with a new

password and can't get in. Or you receive a message: "The supplied username is already linked to an existing web portal account."

A: You may not have the correct password. Use "forgot password?" link at the bottom of the login page. Follow the steps in the password reset e-mail. If you do not receive an e-mail, check your spam/junk folder. If the e-mail is not present, please contact Member Services to ensure the correct e-mail is on file.

Q: What are the password requirements?

A: A password must be a minimum of eight characters and the password may not be the same as the one previously used. There are no other requirements. New passwords will require to be entered twice exactly the same way to be accepted.

Q: What if I forget my password?

A: On the login screen below the boxes with Member Number, Password and Login, there is a link "forgot your password? Click the link, enter your member number and click on the blue box "Send Reset Link." You will receive an e-mail from SUNCITYWESTADMIN, click on the "Link to reset password" and follow the instructions. Confirm Username is your member number. Enter New Password (must be at least eight characters and is case sensitive). Confirm Password (re-enter password exactly the same). Click on the blue box Change Password. If successful, you will be taken directly into the website and will receive and e-mail confirming you have changed your password.

Q: If you receive the message: "The Username/E-mail could not be found."

A: This message means the username or e-mail address is missing or incorrect in the database. You will need to contact Member Services to update your record.

Q: My spouse and I share the same e-mail address, will that work for both of us?

A: No. Each member number/account must have a separate and different e-mail address.

Q: Can I cancel or change a tee time online?

A: No. All cancellations or changes are made by directly contacting the golf course.
