Hot tunes, cool flicks land in Beardsley Park

Join the Rec Centers of Sun City West as we step out into the cool evenings of October to enjoy weekends filled with concerts and movies at Beardsley Park.

Saturday night concerts and Sunday evening movies return to Beardsley Park beginning Oct. 3. Tickets are \$5 per person per concert and go on sale Sept. 15 at the R.H. Johnson Box Office, 19803 N R.H. Johnson Blvd. Tickets will only be available for Sun City West residents.

We will require Sun City West residents to have a ticket and their Sun City West rec card to enter our Concerts in the Park for the 2020 fall season. At this point we are not allowing guests for the safety of our community! You will need to show your rec card to receive a ticket for entry at the park.

We also will encourage masks when entering the gate, using restrooms, or purchasing any-

thing from our concessions at Ramada 4. Social distancing will be monitored! Companions can sit next to each other, but please be mindful to others around you as we are heavily practicing social distancing in all events around the community. We are restricting these events to 1,000 people and the Ramadas will be open for more dancing areas.

Partial concessions will be available – soda, water and select pre-packaged snacks.

Rec Centers eye benchmarks to reopen fitness centers

Although (as of press time) Maricopa County has not reached the new benchmarks established by the state to lift Gov. Doug Ducey's closure of gyms and fitness centers, the Rec Centers of Sun City West is preparing for that eventuality.

Ducey's order originally closed gyms through July 27. However, that was extended and was set to be "reviewed for repeal or revision every two weeks."

The Arizona Department of Health Services in mid-August released benchmarks for gyms, fitness centers and theaters to reopen. Those benchmarks required cases, percent positivity in tests, and COVID-like illnesses reported to hospitals to be below their current levels before affected businesses can reopen.

Additional details about the benchmarks can be found on the ADHS website under its Business Dashboard. They include two levels; in the first, the centers may reopen at 25 percent capacity; in the second, the centers may reopen at 50 percent capacity. The Rec Centers will likely open at even lower capacities due to physical distancing requirements and the need to eliminate congregation points.

In summary, the state's benchmarks include the following (for two consecutive weeks in Maricopa County):

- Cases per 100,000 must be below 100 per 100,000 population
- Percent positivity must be below 10 percent
- Hospital visits for COVID-like illnesses must be below 10 percent

Plans call for the fitness centers at R.H. Johnson and Palm Ridge recreation centers to open once the benchmarks are met; once the Association's "attestation" is accepted; and as soon as personnel and adequate cleaning supplies are in place. That may require the centers to open on different dates. Logistics are still being worked out. The initial reopening will not include the table tennis and racquetball at R.H. Johnson. Kuentz and Beardsley will remain closed. (Clubs at Kuentz and Beardsley that were opened earlier remain open.)

Shifting of personnel may mean that only one center opens initially. Additional staff are needed to provide temperature checks, continuous sanitation practices, and ensure members are wearing masks, as required by ADHS. "As we've mentioned before, you don't have to like the masks, but you do have to wear them," said General Manager Bill Schwind. "Failure to comply can result in ADHS shutting us down and member privileges

SCW plans new Membership-Golf Portal

Sun City West members and golfers are advised the Rec Centers will unveil a new online portal in the near future, which will affect all those who use the platform to pay dues, make tee times and place lottery requests.

All current users (residents and public cardholders who have a public player number) must activate their accounts on the new portal; this is a simple process wherein each member, upon visiting the new portal for the first time, will click on the activation button, then respond to the automatic email they will receive.

Those who do not use the portal currently can create an account on the site. All users must have their own email address to use the portal; shared emails will not be allowed.

The official launch date for the new portal has

not yet been set but it is expected to roll out in the next several weeks.

The Sun City West web portal, different from the regular website, allows members to pay their dues, check their statements, see their golf history, make tee times and place lottery requests. Public players will be able to book tee times through the portal.

Along with aesthetic and usability improvements, the portal will include a link and auto login to new scheduling software where members and guests can book a lesson or clinic with a pro or book time in the new Golf Lab.



being revoked.”

All members entering the fitness center/pool lobbies will be screened with contactless thermometers, regardless of whether they are entering a gym, pool or indoor walking track.

Once reopened, the fitness centers will have a sign-up sheet for one-hour reservations. Between each one-hour block, a half hour is reserved for staff to sanitize the entire gym and equipment. Additional cleaning will occur on the equipment between users, per ADHS. Members must sign up in person;

guests are not allowed. No more than 10 individuals and up to two residents who are utilizing personal training services will be allowed in the gyms at one time.

The last phase of the Rec Centers reopening plan involves the social clubs and those such as dancing, exercise and others that require physical interaction. Those are still closed until further guidance from the CDC and ADHS.






OCT. 17 Johnny K & Kompany

Board, committees begin 'meeting' again this month

Once again it's time for the September Rec Center News, which is our way of informing and communicating with our owner members about what's happening in our community in the coming year.

In July we had our yearly Workshop, and developed a list of six goals for the Board to focus on in the coming fiscal year. We will cover this new information in our upcoming workshops for review, discussion, and action plans. I encourage each owner member to review the posted agendas for workshops and committee meetings. (Visit gb.suncitywest.com). This process allows owner members to hear and provide input on any actions or policy changes the Board is making.

The following is a very brief consolidation of what was discussed at our July workshop:

1. Community Master Plan. With the review of our assets and the current layout of our properties, we are engaging specific consultants to focus on areas that each excels at, and to bring a total overview of all the facilities.

2. CC&Rs, Late Fees, Collections, and Liens. Each of these areas are being reviewed to comply with current Arizona Statutes.

3. Club Improvements and

Funding. This is a hot topic for sure. Any policy we develop to address this will discuss needs versus wants; active versus enrolled members; safety; and like-for-like replacement.

4. Owner Member Dues. THIS IS NOT ABOUT INCREASES, but rather to provide clarity on what the dues are used for under Arizona Revised Statute 33-1801.

5. Revised Budgeting Process. This will look at the timing of our process, which right now starts in December and ends in May. We are doing the best to streamline the process and get the budget completed sooner to better enable Owner Member input and refine our process.

6. The Reserve Fund Status. You can expect this to be a frequent subject of discussion with the Board. Once again, we will be having a mid-year review in January, so the community can have up-to-date information about what is covered in our Reserve Study, and how much we have set aside to handle the needs.

I invite you to take the time to attend some of these; our hope is we can once again have meetings in person, but if not, you can still participate. Agendas will be put out on gb.suncitywest.com at least 48 hours before each meeting. They will include instructions on where the meeting is taking place, or how you can attend virtually if we are still not meeting face to face. You can also submit questions during these meetings to questions@suncitywest.com; or send questions in advance to the Director who chairs the committee you're interested in. You can find all email addresses on Page 4 of the Rec Center News.

Now a few quick items. If you would like to sit down and talk, I hold President's Hours from 9 to 11 a.m. Mondays; call Executive Assistant Karen Roepken at 623-544-6115 for an appointment. Above all: Be safe, wear your mask (remember it is for others, and it is the least we can do for our friends and neighbors); wash your hands often or use sanitizer; and know we are all in this together.

At the present time we have openings for dispatchers.


Training for new patrolling Posse members will restart with classes beginning Sept 21.

Helping Hands temporarily closing on Fridays

When Helping Hands, a division of Sun City West Foundation, heard that elective surgery was back in place, the Board of Directors knew the importance of having equipment available for residents having surgery. Therefore, Helping Hands will remain open from 9 to noon Monday through Thursday, shortening their open hours by closing on Friday. This closing is on a temporary basis through the COVID-19 pandemic, as this is having a great impact on trying to staff the facility.

As in most organizations today, business is being done differently at Helping Hands, allowing only one customer into the office at a time and snug-fitting face coverings consistent with the guidance provided by the U.S. Centers of Disease Control and Preven-



tion are required by customers and staff.

The Helping Hands staff cleans every piece of equipment returned into the warehouse, removing all visible soil and the majority of equipment is disinfected with chemicals to kill 99.9 percent of bacteria, viruses and fungi - then pressure washed to rinse. The remainder of the equipment, such as mattresses and strollers, are sterilized with a commercial steam machine.

Boats, mobile homes, recreational vehicles shall not kept, placed, maintained, parked or repaired on any lot, common area, tract or street within the subdivision.

Friendly reminders from your Sun City West CC&R Department!

Recreational Vehicles: No mobile home, boat, recreational vehicle, commercial vehicle or trailer of any type shall be kept, placed, maintained parked or repaired upon any lot, common area, tract, or street (public or private) within the subdivision; provided however that the provision of this paragraph shall not apply to minor vehicle repairs, cleaning, loading or unloading and short term parking which shall be permitted for a cumulative period not to exceed seventy-two hours in any calendar month. However, if due to the COVID-19 outbreak, if an essential worker or family member is using it to self-isolate you need to contact the CC&R office and make special arrangements.

Age Restriction: Each single-family residence shall be occupied by at least one person not less than 55 years of age and no person under the age of 19 shall reside in any family residence.

Storage Buildings: No storage buildings or sheds shall be moved, placed, assembled, constructed, or otherwise maintained on any lot.

Gazebos and Pergolas: An owner may construct no more than one gazebo or pergola in the backyard of the home so long as said gazebo or pergola meets minimum criteria. Please contact the CC&R Department for additional details.

Sanitation Containers: No garbage or trash shall be placed or kept except in covered containers. In no event shall such containers be maintained to be visible from neighboring property except to make available for collection and then only the shortest time reasonably necessary to affect such collection. All rubbish, trash, or garbage shall be removed from the lots and shall not be allowed to accumulate.



Please note, due to the influx of calls during delays, you may

experience a busy signal. Please be patient and keep trying to call any course. During October through April, Monday through Friday, you may reach the call center who will have the latest updates for all courses.

Our Rain Check policy may be found here.

Frost occurs when temperatures are at approximately 38 degrees and below. Typically, at 38 degrees, it will cause a 30-minute delay and a 30-minute cart path only restriction; at 35 degrees, a one hour to 90-minute delay; at 34 degrees a two hour delay.

Practice golf cart etiquette to avoid course damage

Now that more carts are on the courses and some courses are working with less staff than usual, everyone needs to help keep the courses nice.

Golf Operations is glad to have everyone back playing the Sun City West golf courses! We understand with the great course conditions and improve pace of play we are seeing more golfers. However, with the additional cart traffic comes more wear and tear on the course that can result in long term damage and unfavorable playing conditions if we are not careful. There has been a lot of abuse of cart rules since we reopened on May 4.

To keep great course conditions, we need golfers to do their part. Please adhere to these cart rules to keep our golf courses in great shape:

- Stay on and return to cart path as often as possible

- Use the 90 degree cart path rule whenever it makes sense

- Stay on cart paths around tees and greens
- Carts should never drive between a green side bunker and the green

- If a cart is on the opposite side of the green from cart path, the cart should be 15 feet for medical flag players and at least 30 feet from green for all other golfers. If you are on the cart path side of the green, you should return to the cart path and park the cart on the path. Carts around the green is where we see most of the damage to the golf course.

- Stay out of desert as much as possible, enter at your own risk. Fleet carts are not allowed in the desert.

If someone in your group is not following the above rules, remind them. Old habits die hard!



Frequently Asked Questions

Q: When is a ball considered out of bounds?

A: Under Rule 18/18.2a. When the entire ball comes to rest outside of the boundary edge. The boundary edge is defined by the line between the course-side points of the stakes at ground level, and the stakes are out of bounds. The boundary edge is the course-side edge of the line, and the line itself is out of bounds. Out of bounds stakes and lines are typically white. Other boundary edges are property lines that may not be marked in white, i.e. fences, walls, a line of landscape pavers, etc. The penalty for out of bounds is stroke and distance. If a ball is out of bounds, a player must take the stroke-and-distance relief by adding one penalty stroke and playing a ball from where the previous stroke was made (see Rule 14.6).


