Human Resources

- There were two COVID cases reported to us regarding employees last week.
- RCSCW COVID Task Force meets as necessary to evaluate the latest information from the Arizona Dept. of Health and the CDC and prepare updated guidelines. We are currently mandating employees/volunteers wear masks when dealing with residents and/or outside guests or when they leave their workstations. If they maintain a 6 ft. distance from other employees, a mask is not mandated. Plexi-glass shields have been reinstated where they were previously located.
- Minimum wage goes up to \$12.80 as of 1/1/22 (5.3% increase).
- Staff Managers reminded that the Gov. Board is looking for recognition suggestions.
- HR would like all employee recognition suggestions to be turned in by next week.
- We plan to partner with Walgreen's this year to offer flu shots to RCSCW employees. Date is to be determined.

- B & F Committee Meeting on Tuesday. Clifton Larson Auditor will be there to present audit (no findings) and talk about deferred Revenue as reported income.
- May, June, July Financials are completed. Accounting is working on August Month-End Report.
- We converted investments to Pershing from JP Morgan Chase last week.
- Accounting is working on the next Budget Time-Line to present to B&F.
- K-Hovnanian Homes was issued their Certificate of Occupancy which triggers the dues owed to the Rec. Centers.
- We are working on a Cell Tower counter proposal for a tower already on our property and working on a proposal for a new cell tower we were recently approached with.

Golf Operations

- For the first 19 days of September:
 - Rounds of Golf Rounds are down by 5% vs. September 2020. Revenue for green fees/cart fees are down by 3% vs. September 2020.
- Call Center Hired 3 new Call Center employees. Interviews will be held on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. Need to hire three new employees. Positions start the first week of October.
- 2-Person Best Ball Tournament Played Saturday, September 18th 42 Teams (84 Players). 76 men and 12 ladies participated. There were three flights; Net and gross prizes in each flight.
- **26**th **Annual Octogenarian Golf Tournament** Entry forms went out on Monday, Sept. 13th. 60% of the 92 players have signed up and paid. Echo Mesa Golf Course will host this12:00 p.m. shotgun start event.
- Player Assistant Training Today and tomorrow at the Lecture Hall. We will discuss philosophy and goals for the upcoming year.
- Yellow Range Balls 65,000 have arrived and will be put into play after overseeding. These balls will help with shortening the time a golfer is on the range floor looking for their wayward ball and less likely to be hit from the range tee. They are easier to see.
- Course Closures During overseeding, 4 courses will close on 9/24/21 (Stardust, Echo Mesa, Trail Ridge and Deer Valley). Courses open during this time are Pebblebrook, Grandview and Desert Trails. There will be no group play due to the closures and all tee times will be made through the lottery system.

Golf Course Maintenance/Landscape Management

Course Maintenance:

- Overseeding Begins this week at Echo Mesa, Trail Ridge, Deer Valley and Stardust. Seed for the fairways and greens was delivered last Friday. Seed for the greens is to be delivered Wednesday. All four courses should be finished seeding by Tuesday of next week. The first courses will reopen on Tuesday, October 19th.
- Grandview Well Pump Transfer Line We have a leak in our well pump transfer line at Grandview Golf Course. Apache Pipeline is scheduled to make repairs sometime this week. Grandview will be getting water from Echo Mesa.

Landscape Maintenance:

- We continue to perform General Landscape Maintenance.
- Softball Field Overseeding is scheduled for September 29th.
- Staff has removed summer flowers to prepare the beds for the winter flowers which will start going in early next month.
