





Here we go again

The Governing Board for the Recreation Centers of Sun City West began meeting again in September. The Board meetings as well as the various committees are taking up where they left off last June.

In September, the new Board Directors get into the swing of the Board's duties. With two new Directors this year, September was spent in training as the Board reviewed our governing documents as well as the federal and state laws that govern RCSCW as a planned community and a non-profit corporation that follows the Housing for Older Persons Act. The definitions and laws are a lot to learn for new Directors, but experienced directors act as mentors. All the new members come with a desire to serve our great community.

The Board is legally mandated to meet in open session any time there is a quorum of directors present. State open meeting laws for planned communities require meetings to be held on Association property. An agenda of topics that will be

discussed must be posted at least 48 hours in advance of the meeting. Any topic not on the agenda cannot be discussed by the Board.

Board workshops are working sessions for the Directors to fully discuss topics; however, no voting takes place at workshops. Voting only takes place at regular meetings, special meetings or executive ses-

Our regular meetings are held September through June, usually on the third Tuesday of each month unless it conflicts

with holidays. Special meetings can be called at any time throughout the year and are called to take care of some urgent business that cannot wait for an upcoming meeting.

Workshops, general meetings and special meetings are open to any cardholder.

Prior to any voting on each topic at a regular or special meeting, the Board must make time to hear from Association Cardholders. The statutes allow the Board to put a reasonable time limit on speakers, and the Board can limit speakers if a fair representation is made by having equal number speak on both sides of a topic.

At workshops (even though there is no voting) the Board's practice is to allow cardholders to comment at the end of the meeting. When there are topics of great interest to the members, the chair has allowed comments after specific topics at these working sessions.

Meetings are for the Governing Board to discuss and decide on issues impacting the community, and we encourage our cardholders to attend and participate by sharing their comments.

Executive sessions are exceptions under the open meeting statutes, and can be closed for only five reasons:

1. Legal advice from an at-

Members: Are you renting your property?

Are you renting out your property?

Should you decide to rent your property, you need to be aware of the requirements your tenants will need to use the facilities:

- All Owners/Associate members must be in good tanding.
- All Owner/Associate member cards will be suspended while there are active Tenants on the property.
- There must be one active Owner or Associate or Landlord member for every one Tenant card issued.
- One Owner = only one Tenant card issued unless a second Owner card (called Landlord Card) is purchased. This creates two Owner cards, and two Tenants cards can be issued.
- An Owner-signed lease, or a Request for Tenant Activity Card form signed by the Owner, must be submitted to Member Services.

- One Tenant residing on the property must be at lease fifty-five (55) years of age.
- No one under nineteen (19) shall reside in the residence.
 - Tenant cards are non-refundable, non-transferable.
- Tenants without a member card residing more than 30 days are not considered a guest and must purchase a Tenant Activity card to use the facilities.

Owners are responsible to ensure that any company/person managing their rental property is adhering to all policies. If you have questions, please call Member Services at 623-544-6100 between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m. Monday through Friday.


How we became Flag City U.S.A.

On Presidents Day 1988, 100 American flags were flown on Sun City West's major thoroughfare. For 35 years, this flag-flying project, sponsored by American Legion Post 94, has continued on R.H. Johnson Boulevard on patriotic holidays.

The flag project was the idea of Lloyd Kilmer, a new Sun City West resident from Omaha, Nebraska in 1986.

Disappointed that he saw no widespread flying of U.S. flags in the community on national holidays, Kilmer promoted and then chaired the plan to have flags flying all along R.H. Johnson Boulevard.

After obtaining support from the local American

Sun City West residents and businesses donated funds to purchase the first 100 flags. The flags were obtained from Sen. John McCain who had the flags flown over the U.S. Capitol before they were sent to Sun City West.

Former Gov. Rose Mofford proclaimed Sun City West as a "Flag City U.S.A.," allowing for a sign designating the community as such to stand at the entrance to the community.

In addition to Presidents Day, five other holidays were originally designated as days for the flags to be flown: Flag Day, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, and Veterans Day. Flag-flying days added later include Martin Luther King, Jr. Day; Patriot Day, which commemorates Sept. 11; and Pearl Harbor Day. In March 2023, flags were raised to honor the 50th anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War.

Pedestrians, drivers – watch out for one another

As the days get shorter and the weather cooler more residents are out walking early in the morning and in the evening. When you walk, the safest place is on the sidewalk, facing traffic. Wear at least one light or whitecolored article of clothing so you can be seen. Many people put reflecting tape on their clothing or carry a light. We see too many residents wearing all dark clothing and walking in the street with their back to traffic!

The Governor of Arizona has funded re-establishment of the Maricopa County Traffic Enforcement Unit. Maricopa County has not had this type of unit for about 15 years. There will be a motorcycle unit plus "ghost" cars (unmarked sedans). The units' sole responsibility will be to enforce traffic laws. One of these unmarked cars will be based in the Sun City West area and will operate in Sun City West.

MCSO has been writing tickets, mostly for speeding, in Sun City West. More than 80 percent of the stops are Sun City West residents. It's easy to let the speed creep up. If you use cruise control and remain vigilant your speed will remain constant. Remember, if there is a patrol car with blue and red

lights behind you, it is a MCSO Deputy. Some Posse cars have the same lights but members don't drive with them on and the Posse never makes a traffic stop.

A Posse member weekly compiles data from Posse records summarizing incidents occurring in Sun City West where Posse responds.

July saw a 10 percent increase in Sun City West service calls over June. Thank you for calling. The Sun City West Posse answers phone calls from around 5:30 a.m. to after 11 p.m., to help you. Most categories are up including welfare checks. Fortunately, the Posse response to auto collisions is the only category that is down.

RUOK is a Maricopa County voluntary program where you will receive a phone call each day to check on you. If you are part of the program and are not going to be able to answer the phone for a period of time or you wish to opt out, there is a number in the paperwork from the County or call Posse for information to suspend or cancel the service.

cess of the flag-flying project, and as Sun City West continued to expand, it was decided to have a Memorial Boulevard of Flags, flying casket flags exclusively. More than 200 families donated the first casket flags, which recognized veterans of the Spanish American War, World War I, World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War. Within a year or two of the first donations of casket flags, Sun City West had flags to cover five miles of R.H. Johnson Boulevard.

According to Ronald Ripley, the current Flag Chairman for American Legion Post 94, casket flags continue to fly on R.H. Johnson Boulevard as

Sun City West residents continue flag donations. Each 5foot by 9-foot flag bears the inscription of the veteran's name, birth and death dates, and branch of military service. Donated flags are retired when they are no longer serviceable.

About 30 teams of two to four members of the Sun City West American Legion Post raise and lower the flags for each patriotic holiday. In between the holiday flag flying, the flags are stored at the Foundation Building in Flag City U.S.A.

2. Pending or contemplated litigation.

3. Personal, health or financial information about an individual member of the Association, an individual employee of the Association or an individual employee of a contractor for the Association, including records of the Association directly related to those issues.

4. Matters relating to the job performance of, compensation of, health records of or specific complaints against an individual employee of the Association or an individual employee of a contractor of the Association who works under the direction of the Association.

5. Discussion of a member's appeal of any violation cited or penalty imposed by the Association, except if the member requests an open session.

Executive session agendas and meeting minutes are considered confidential informa-

There are actions that the Board is mandated to do, but there are also things that the Board sets out for itself to accomplish during its term. Some topics the Board will be working on this fiscal year:

• Emphasizing through policy the concept that RCSCW cardholders should always be the priority in any activity. There was a lot of discussion last year about non-residents using our facilities. All cardholders in good standing are allowed to bring guests, of

course. However, we need to take a closer look at some areas where non-residents are included in our activities.

- An idea that germinated around golf and bowling fees last year was differentiating cardholder guest fees from non-resident fees.
- Controlling our expenses regarding credit card fees will continue to be discussed.

Each quilt was created around the Carpenter's Wheel, but each took on a unique look through the use of differing borders. The colors were selected in honor of my husband's 31-year career with the U.S. Navy. This quilt and



the other two in the study were made over a two-month period. This quilt hangs in my home from Memorial Day through Labor Day. It was quilted by Sherrie Smith of Vista, Calif.

I began quilting when I was pregnant with my first child; every child needs a quilt of his or her own. I have been quilting now for 34 years through numerous moves across this country and overseas.

During our travels, I have belonged to many quilt guilds. I have found that being a quilter brings a ready-made group of friends wherever we move.

As a quilt teacher for the past 25 years, I have enjoyed showing my students that they can create their own quilted legacies for future generations. I enjoy the challenge of creating a quilt by a design-as-I-go process, with no preconceived notion of what it will become. The results are always fulfilling and often surprising.




