March election to include parking referendum

Sun City West Owner Members will be asked during March's Governing Board Election if they want the Recreation Centers of Sun City West to continue enforcing CC&Rs related to street parking.

The Rec Centers currently enforces RV, boat, trailer, utility and other long-term vehicle parking on our streets. The state Legislature passed a new law this year that will remove that authority, unless residents reaffirm it.

Without a positive vote by a quorum of members, the Rec Centers and its CC&R Department will have no jurisdiction over whether RVs and other




Rec Centers' stop signs: Stop means stop!

key role in the success of active-adult retirement communities, especially those located in the warmer climates of the south and southwest where the sun always shines, and the grass remains green all year long.

For the Del Webb Corporation, golf was also an important sales tool to promote Sun City West during its early years.

John Meeker, president of the Del E. Webb Development Co. (DEVCO) realized that hosting Senior and Ladies Professional Golf Association tournaments would give the new community national exposure. Hillcrest Golf Course - the largest and most elaborate golf course ever developed by the company would be the perfect site for such tournaments.

Recognizing the value and importance of golf to the new community, Mr. Meeker had envisioned building a golf course in

Golf has always played a Sun City West that would be among the finest in the nation. Prior to Sun City West's opening, he exclaimed "I'll build an open pit mine in the center that will become a golf course in an emerald valley."

More than 2.4 million cubic yards of earth were moved to create a rolling valley, lagoons, brooks, and bunkers. When it opened in February 1979, the 6,960-yard Par 72 course was considered one of the three most challenging courses in all of Arizona.

One year later, the course hosted its first LPGA tournament - a \$100,000 classic won by Jan Stephensen. More than 50,000 spectators turned out to watch the five-day event. The LPGA returned in 1981 and 1982.

In April 1984, Hillcrest hosted the \$200,000 Senior PGA Roundup - attracting such golf legends as Arnold Palmer, Sam Snead, Julius Boros, Billy







Condo insurance change may affect costs

The Arizona Legislature passed several laws this year that affect both Condominium and Planned Community HOAs.

Gail Olsen, an OHOA Board director and treasurer, explains how changes to the Arizona Condominium Insurance Statute may affect the cost and availability of insurance coverage.

Effective Oct. 30, Arizona House Bill 2251 added two new provisions to A.R.S. § 33-1253

regarding the requirements condominiums must meet with respect to insurance coverage:

1. Unit owners will now have the right to report a loss directly to the insurance carrier under the condominium association's



property insurance policy. Prior to reporting the loss to the carrier, a unit owner is first required to report the loss to the association and give the association ten (10) business days to provide the unit owner with a written decision on whether the association will be reporting a claim under the master policy, including the reason behind any decision not to file a claim.

This new provision potentially has the effect of increasing claims on an association's master insurance policy, which can result in increased premiums and potentially making the association uninsurable. Insurance agents and community association attorneys are recommending increasing the association's insurance deductibles significantly to counteract this effect. An increase in the association insurance deductible means that condominium unit owners should also increase their property insurance coverage to cover the additional amount for which the unit owner will be responsible in the event of a claim.

2. A condominium association is now required to inform each unit owner annually in writing of both: (a) the unit's owner's responsibility for the association's insurance deductibles for all property and liability coverage; and (b) the amount of each deductible. This provision converts what has previously been a "best practice" for condominium associations into a legal requirement.

Before coming to this position, Karen had a very successful business career in consumer products marketing, where she held several positions of responsibility.

THE GENERAL MANAGER

The General Manager reports to the Governing Board through the Board President. Each year the Governing Board reviews the Association's Governing Documents, the Bylaws and Policies, which authorize the General Managers powers and responsibilities. The General Manager's authorized powers and restrictions are enumerated in Bylaw Article 7, some of which is as follows:

7.3.1 The powers and duties of the General Manager are as follows:

7.3.1.1 Administer and manage the Association's staff to efficiently accomplish the policies, goals, and directives of the Governing Board...

7.3.1.2 Administer and supervise the Association's Human Resources Program.

7.3.1.2.1 Review employee compensation and benefit policies annually and submit recommendations to the Governing Board for approval.

7.3.1.3 Formulate and implement a succession/replacement plan to ensure effective management continuity at all levels of the organization, both short and long term.

7.3.1.5.2 Provide recommendations and justification for adjustments in annual dues, fees, rental charges, and special assessments.

7.3.1.7 Establish and implement, within limits established by Governing Board policies or authority delegated by the Governing Board, operating instructions and procedural guidelines for internal controls, routine operations, marketing, and resident programs with timely notification to the Governing Board.

It may be easier to think of the relationship between the Governing Board and the General Manager this way: Each year the elected Governing Board reviews the Governing Documents for relevancy. The Association Governing Documents define a framework that delineates what the General Manager can and cannot do. In areas not covered by the Association Governing Documents, the Governing Board authorizes the General Manager to utilize their experience to make the best business judgement. It would be too cumbersome to have a written policy for every potential situation that may arise. However, when issues arise to a significant level, the Governing Board discusses the situation and can expire, amend, or create new policies.

Mr. Schwind brings to the Association more than 38 years of

leadership experience in public service and non-profit administration.

Mr. Schwind received a bachelor's degree and Certified Public Manager (CPM) diplomas from Arizona State University as well as a certificate in Public Policy and Management from the University of Arizona.

He was appointed by two Arizona Governors, Napolitano and Brewer, to serve as Chairman of the Arizona Outdoor Recreation Coordinating Commission (AORCC) 2006-2014.

He has also served on the Arizona Parks and Recreation Association Executive Board for three years as well as President of APRA in 2014.

Mr. Schwind has received numerous awards for innovative programing and recreational programs.

Since Mr. Schwind has been at RCSCW, he has used his extensive experience to guide the Association through some tough challenges.

The nightmare of COVID-19 saw an environment where even the medical experts were not sure about how to deal with the worldwide pandemic. He followed the state and local medical mandates and closed some of our amenities. With 20-20 hindsight, people may argue that the procedures were not fully necessary, but in the heat of the moment, Mr. Schwind made decisions based on protecting our vulnerable residents. The Governing Board at that time fully supported Mr.

Schwind's decisions.

Several years ago, it came to light that several craft clubs were in violation of their IRS 501(c)7 non-profit status. Some clubs and their members were producing crafts to sell, and the collected revenue was larger than the IRS allowed for 501(c)7 Social Clubs. RCSCW was in the middle of this fiasco by allowing the Village Store to handle these transactions. This arrangement put the Craft Clubs' non-profit status in jeopardy that could have resulted in large tax repercussions. This also pointed out that a few residents were using RCSCW club facilities to make crafts on a commercial level. To make a clear break, the Governing Board approved the closing of the Village Store at the 9/23/2021 GB Regular meeting.

PORA, taking over the consignment sales of crafts from individual artists, corrected several issues. It alleviated the Club tax issues, it removed RCSCW from the sales pipeline and individual crafters will be getting IRS Form 1099 for their sales.

There have been other issues where Mr. Schwind has made recommendations for action to the Governing Board. Each of these issues were discussed by the Governing Board, but it is ultimately your elected Governing Board that makes the final decision.

Mr. Schwind is a valued asset to the Association. And that's a fact.

number of negative encounters that have been reported at our facilities. Residents and guests are reminded that aggressive language or behavior directed at staff (especially front-line employees) or other members and guests is prohibited by Policy L01, which states:

It is the Policy of the Recreation Centers of Sun City West, Inc. that all parties involved in any physical altercation or any other inappropriate or unsafe conduct on Association property may lose their privileges to utilize certain Association facilities and/or suffer other penalties.

1.1 This includes but is not limited to:

1.1.1 Sexual harassment or abuse, disruptive actions or gestures, or unsafe or threatening action.

1.1.2 Use of inappropriate language, i.e., profanity.

1.1.3 Interfering with the enjoyment and reasonable use of



facilities by others.

1.1.4 Continuous failure to follow reasonable instruction or request from Association Staff.

1.1.5 Violation of State or Federal statutes and/or Association Governing Documents.

1.1.6 Refusal to promptly pay fee or fine.

1.1.7 Any repeated voluntary or involuntary, action by any Association Owner Member, Associate Member, tenant or guest that jeopardizes the health, safety or security of themselves or other users of the Association facilities.

Members who have an issue or concern with an Association policy, the staff's enforcement of that policy, or another non-emergency issue, may address those concerns with the facility manager and/or fill out a Member Comment Form.

But it was the television exposure that mattered most, as it introduced millions of viewers from across the country to Del Webb's newest active-adult re-tirement community.

The Webb company underwrote the expenses for the tournaments in the early years and eventually turned them into benefits for Boswell Memorial Hospital in Sun City.

The last Senior PGA tournament was held at Hillcrest Golf Course in 1988 before moving to the Pointe Resort in Phoenix.

Parking law goes up for vote

large vehicles can remain parked on the streets indefinitely. The new law, Arizona Revised

Statute 33-1818, states:

A. Notwithstanding any provision in the community documents, after the period of declarant control, an association has no authority over and shall not regulate any roadway for which the ownership has been dedicated to or is otherwise held by a governmental entity.

According to HB 2298, the House Bill that put the change into effect, Sun City West and other communities that were recorded before Jan. 1, 2015, also will lose enforcement ability, but unlike the newer communities, they have an opportunity to override it. Communities like Sun City West must hold a membership vote prior to June 30, 2025, allowing members to decide if they want their communities to continue enforcing CC&Rs related to roadways. If the election is not held by that date, or if residents do not pass the measure, then the Rec Centers will be forced to stop enforcing street regulations.

The question will be put to members alongside the Election for Governing Board Directors on March 25. Information about registering to vote, early voting and other details will be announced closer to the Election.




YOGA
