

'Jumpin' Jehosophat'! The Lizard Acres story

In 1971 and 1972, as Sun City was being completed, the Del E. Webb Development Company (DEVCO) purchased 13,000 acres of land to the west for eventual development. The purchase included 15 parcels of land owned separately. One of those parcels has an intriguing history—the area known as Lizard Acres.

Lizard Acres was the nickname for the Circle One Livestock Company, a 1,800 -acre cattle feed lot owned by E.S. Spurlock and J.C. "Charlie" Wetzler. The story goes that in the 1940s, as the two men drove over the land that would eventually become Sun City West, Spurlock is reported to have exclaimed, "Jumpin' Jehosophat. This country isn't fit for raising any-

In September 1944, Mark Gemmill, from Prescott, was hired as foreman for the Circle One Livestock Company. He, his wife Gloria, and their infant son moved, first to a trailer on the ranch and later, built a home there, where they lived for the next 30 years, until their house was demolished to make room for the retirement community of Sun City West.

The Gemmill home was one of three dwellings and a dozen trailers and tents that housed up to 45 employees at the height of the ranch activity. Life was initially quite primitive. Everyone had to share one outhouse!



Friends Lecture Series returns to Library


This month's Friends of the Library lecture is a combination of lecture and author book talk.




books. He has won 38 statewide, regional, and national journalism awards.



25,000 cattle called Lizard Acres home

Near the home of the Gemmill family were rows of cattle pens, topped with shade awnings. Designed by Wetzler and built by Gemmill, these awnings were the first for the cattle industry.

The cattle were fed on approximately 800 acres. Up to 25,000 head of cattle could be housed at the ranch at one time. The remaining 1,000 acres were devoted to growing a variety of corn, wheat, vegetables, alfalfa, and fruit. Grain sorghum was raised to help fatten the cattle before selling them.

Three irrigation wells and two domestic wells provided water to Lizard Acres. These units still help to provide water to Sun City West. A red lizard, used as a weather vane, decorated one of the ranch's water tanks. Lizard Acres became one of the most successful cattle operations in the Southwest in what is now the southeast corner of Sun City West.

Driving west on Grand Avenue, about a half mile north of the intersection of Bell Road and Grand Avenue, one can still see a small sign designating Lizard Acres along the Santa Fe Railroad tracks.



Arizona Revised Statutes mandate that Association meetings are to be open to members. We encourage our cardholders to attend these meetings, and we provide time for them to make comments. Member feedback is always appreciated.

Each year the RCSCW accounting ledgers and procedures are audited by an outside firm. This was just completed in October by the firm Clifton-LarsonAllen, LLC (CLA). Their report of a clean audit assures the RCSCW cardholders that we are practicing good financial operating practices.

On the capital side: As part of our duty to maintain our facilities and properties, all capital items (over \$5,000 and more than 5-year useful life) are captured in the Reserve Study. The Reserve Study tracks the useful life and replacement costs of all capital items over the next 30 years. Prior to being placed in the annual budget, these items are inspected and reviewed to determine where they are in their useful life. Items that have reached the end of their useful life are included in the capital budget. Items that still have useful life left are postponed to a later year. Conversely, items that have aged quicker than projected are moved forward to an earlier year.

Once on the capital budget, each capital item over \$50,000 is reviewed by the Budget & Finance Committee, and each capital item over \$100,000 must be approved by the Governing Board.

Accountability through Policy

As far as how our Reserve Fund investments are handled, there is a process in place that is transparent, conservative, and thorough. We have a professional investment company, CAPTRUST, that handles our portfolio. CAPTRUST was chosen out of five investment firms by a search committee composed of Directors, members, and our CFO. Each firm was interviewed and ranked by each of the members against a standard that looked for fiscal acumen, communication skills, and ability to stay within the very conservative dictates of the RCSCW fiscal policy. Policy Fi-12 has three criteria for CAPTRUST to invest our Reserve Funds (see pull out box to

In plain language, the policy calls for a very conservative approach to investing that provides: 1) Preservation of Capital, 2) Liquidity, and 3) A Rate of Return versus Inflation. All three goals are important. A common misreading of Fi-12 is to say Preservation of Capital is the ONLY goal that should be considered. Wrong. All three are considered in an investment strategy.

Verification that policies are being followed

In September 2019, CAP-TRUST provided an investment strategy to RCSCW that met all our policy parameters. The Budget & Finance Committee reviewed the investments and concurred that the strategy was fully compliant with Fi-12. The B&F Committee's recommendation to hire CAPTRUST was approved by the Governing Board at the August 2019 General Board Meet-Unforeseen unintended, the U.S. economy suffered an event that had not happened for more than 80 years; both the Stock Market (Equities) and the Open-end Index or actively managed Mutual Funds or Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs) Market both suffered catastrophic declines.

Each year the Budget & Finance Committee reviews CAPTRUST's adherence to

POLICY FI-12 INVESTMENT OF ASSOCIATION FUNDS 1.0 General:

The Association's Governing Board has the fiduciary responsibility to Owner Members to ensure that the Association funds are invested in a prudent and conservative manner. The Association Bylaws entrust the Treasurer of the Association to oversee the implementation and investment of Association funds

2.0 Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to establish a fiscally responsible investment strategy for the Association, subject to periodic review by the Treasurer and Chief Financial Officer.

2.1 Goals & Objectives

The primary objective of the investment program is a conservative and prudent approach to the management of the assets in its investment portfolio(s). The specific goals shall target the preservation of capital, liquidity, and rate of return, in that order.

2.1.1 Preservation of Capital

Preservation of capital is the foremost objective of the investment portfolio(s). Investments shall be made based on an investment strategy that considers the following risk factors:

2.1.1.1 Credit risk

The Association shall minimize credit risk by limiting investment activities to the types of securities detailed in this investment policy.

2.1.1.2 Interest Rate Risk

The Association shall minimize interest rate risk by diversifying its portfolio(s) with approved securities that have differing impact levels to interest rate

2.1.1.3 Market Risk

The portfolio(s) shall provide broad diversification by investing into multiple asset classes within the specified investment parameters set forth in this

2.1.2 Liquidity

Investments shall be made based on cash flow requirements described in section 3.0 of this investment policy. Since all possible cash demands cannot be anticipated, the investment portfolio(s) shall include securities that are easily redeemable or sold in an active secondary market.

2.1.3 Rate of Return

A rate of return shall be sought to address capital needs, operating costs and inflation.

3.1.2 Reserve funds for capital expenditures may be invested based on the specific annual liquidity needs using the following instruments:

- Instruments backed by the full faith and credit of the U.S. Government.
- · Open-end Index or actively managed Mutual Funds or Exchange Traded Funds (ETFs) that trade in:
- o High-credit investment grade quality domestic and international bonds rated by Moody's, Standard & Poor's and/or Fitch rating agencies.
 - o Domestic and international stocks.
- 3.1.2.1 No individual fund shall exceed more than 20% of the investment value of a portfolio.
 - 3.1.2.2 No investments are to be purchased on margin.
- 3.1.2.3 Funds shall be invested in a range of fixed income and equities with equities not to exceed 10% of total investments.

policy Fi-12. The B&F Committee's last review of CAP-TRUST's adherence to our policy was a unanimous recommendation of CAPTRUST to the Governing Board.

Policies and procedures that provide transparency, accountability and verification are the foundations of the Governing Board's fiduciary responsibility to keep RCSCW's fiscal posture strong.

Post Script: If you are retired and have found that sports, crafts or other activities aren't keeping you occupied, please consider running for the Governing Board.
